PANHELLENIC SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION CELEBRATES RECORD-BREAKING YEAR: CONTINUES GOING BEYOND A SCHOLARSHIP

The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation celebrated its annual Alumni Weekend from June 14 – June 15, 2019, awarding 40 exceptional students \$250,000 in scholarships, hosting a mentorship luncheon and announcing a new internship initiative—which will enable the PHSF to continue their goal of going *Beyond a Scholarship*.

This year's Alumni Weekend began with a Welcome Reception Friday evening at Holland & Knight courtesy of the Foundation's pro bono counsel, Elias Matsakis, along with College Year in Athens (CYA). 2019 Recipients, Paradigm Honoree Matina Kolokotronis, PanHellenic Alumni, the Board of Directors, Advisory Board, Scholarship Society Members, and the Academic Committee enjoyed cocktails and hors d'oeuvres while admiring the beautiful Chicago skyline. Mr. Matsakis delivered an inspiring welcome where he described the legacy of Founder Chris P. Tomaras and other dedicated leaders of the community, and the value of paying it forward to help future generations of Hellenism. Following welcome remarks, the Board of Directors, Academic Committee, and Scholarship Society members continued the evening at Lake Point Tower's **Cité** for a private dinner generously hosted by Advisory Board Member **Evangeline** Gouletas. Meanwhile, the PanHellenic Class of 2019 and Alumni stayed at Holland & Knight for dinner where Trustee and Secretary **Athan Tom** Sotos introduced the new recipients to the PanHellenic. Mr. Sotos described how he witnessed Mr. Tomaras build the PanHellenic from a small local scholarship to the great organization it is today. He encouraged all PanHellenic Alumni to work together to keep Mr. Tomaras' dream alive.

Saturday morning, Class of 2019 Recipients, PanHellenic Alumni, and other young professionals met at the **University Club of Chicago** for the 3rd Annual Mentorship Luncheon graciously hosted by **Nicholas Alexos** and sponsored by **The Hellenic Initiative**. Over lunch, students engaged in meaningful advising from an impressive group of fourteen mentors—**Nicholas W. Alexos**, Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer, Dentsply Sirona Inc.; **Victoire H. Cogevina Reynal**, Founder & CEO, Silicon Soccer; **Dimitri Eliopoulos**, Partner & President, Wealth Management, RMB Capital; **Steven Galanis**, Co-Founder & CEO, Cameo; **Georgia Giakoumis Spear, MD**, Chief of the Department of Breast Imaging, NorthShore University, Clinical Assistant Professor of Radiology, University of Chicago; **Michael Konidaris**, Principal Economist, Macroeconomic Advisers by IHS Markit; **John Koudounis**, CEO, Calamos

Investments; **Nick Larigakis**, President & COO, American Hellenic Institute; **Stephen J. After lunch was served, keynote speaker, **Maria Spiropulu**, PhD, Shang-Yi Ch'en Professor of Physics, California Institute of Technology, delivered a powerful address encouraging millennials to continue their good works and give back to the community.

The weekend culminated Saturday evening with the annual Awards Ceremony & Gala at the **Hilton Chicago**. In front of a record-breaking 600+ attendees, 40 of the best and brightest students from across the United States received \$250,000 in scholarships. The evening began with cocktails in the Grand Ballroom proceeded by the **Awards Ceremony** in the impressive International Ballroom. **Tim Gianitsos** and **Christina Moniodis** served as Master and Mistress of Ceremonies—both previous PanHellenic Award recipients who understand the importance of giving back and staying involved with the Foundation and the Hellenic community. Christina and Tim described the impact their scholarships have had on their lives, and they did an excellent job emceeing the event and inspiring all in attendance.

John Manos, Treasurer and Trustee of the PanHellenic, conducted the Awards Ceremony for the 2019 Scholarship recipients. Presenting the awards were **Dr. Tassos Malliaris**, representative of the Academic Committee, along with **Robert A. Buhler**, Chairman and Trustee. Each year, the Foundation is even more impressed by the exceptional group of young Greek Americans who receive awards.

Following the awards distribution, Mr. Buhler delivered the Chairman's report. Here, he unveiled the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation's new **Internship Initiative**. Partnering with 15 inaugural companies, the PanHellenic will help find scholars and alumni internships across multiple industries throughout the nation, starting in Chicago. Mr. Buhler further explained that the PanHellenic is committed to strategically expanding nationally and recognized all new Board of Directors and Advisory Board members from around the country. 2019 PARADIGM HONOREE MATINA KOLOKOTRONIS



The PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation was proud to honor Chicago native **Matina Kolokotronis** with the 2019 Paradigm Award. The Paradigm Award is annually given to a distinguished Greek American whose career achievements and personal accomplishments reflect the Foundation's mission and vision of *building a better America through education and Hellenism*. Honored not only for the professional success they have achieved; Paradigm Award honorees are recognized for upholding the values and ideals of their Hellenic heritage—serving as inspirational figures for our scholarship recipients.

Entering her 23rd season with the NBA, Matina Kolokotronis is a trailblazer who serves as Chief Operating Officer of the Sacramento Kings. She is the only female in the NBA to hold the titles of both COO and President of Business Operations. With decades of experience in sports and government law, community affairs and contract negotiations, Matina's leadership was integral to the development of the award winning Golden 1 Center. Recognized as the greenest and most technologically-advanced

arena in the world, it is the first professional sports venue to achieve LEED Platinum certification.

Matina's leadership extends beyond the Kings organization and into the community where she is a dedicated mentor and advocate for numerous women's advancement groups and non-profits. She strives for inclusivity and is driven to promote policies that benefit working families, as well as women pursuing leadership roles. California Governor Gavin Newsom recently appointed Matina to the California State Protocol Foundation. She was also an Adjunct Professor of Law at McGeorge Law School, University of the Pacific, where she taught Sports Law.

On a personal note, Matina's parents hail from villages outside Tripoli, and met after immigrating to Chicago as teenagers. Matina and her three sisters grew up attending Assumption Greek Orthodox Church and Plato Academy. Her Hellenic upbringing and ties to her heritage have helped shape her personal and professional success. In Sacramento, she is an active member of Annunciation Greek Orthodox Church, which she attends with her husband Sotiris and three children, Constantine, Marisa and Nicholas. Matina feels strongly about instilling a strong Greek connection in her children and strives to provide them with an upbringing that mirrors the close-knit Greek-American community she remembers growing up in Chicago.

At the 2019 Awards Ceremony & Gala, Matina gave a powerful speech, describing her early life and how she became an NBA executive. She highlighted her family's Hellenic values which were instrumental, but the most important aspect of her youth was the "village" her mother created to help Matina during her educational career. She credits her family and community and the support structures that were created to help her academically. She said without that village, her success as an NBA executive would not have been possible.

It was a perfect opportunity for PanHellenic Board members, Advisory Board members, and Academic Committee members to welcome our exceptional 2019 Scholars.

Mr. Matsakis' welcome speech highlighted the legacy of Founder Chris P. Tomaras and the contribution of previous generations of Greek Americans who worked hard to build the close-knit Greek American community that we know. Additionally, Endy Zemenides, a member of CYA's Board of Trustees, spoke to the importance of studying abroad in Greece, especially as a Greek American. Zemenides explained to the Class of 2019 and Alumni that going to Greece with CYA allows a Greek American to experience Greece in a completely different light. PanHellenic Trustee and Secretary, Tom Sotos gave a moving speech about the trials and tribulations Mr. Tomaras endured before obtaining success as an entrepreneur. Tom explained how Mr. Tomaras valued education, but due to financial hardship could not complete his degree at Columbia University's business school. After selling his company, Kronos Gyros, he established the PanHellenic Scholarship Foundation, to help Greek American youth obtain an education. Most importantly, Tom highlighted that in order to keep this Foundation going, Alumni need to help give back when they are ready—whether it is through volunteering or donating. Around 9 pm PanHellenic Alumni and Class of 2019 Recipients left Holland & Knight and took a trolley tour throughout the Chicago Loop, ending in Greektown.

The next morning over 100 PanHellenic Alumni, Class of 2019 Recipients, and other Greek American young professionals met at the University Club of Chicago for the 3rd Annual Mentorship Luncheon, kindly sponsored by Nicholas Alexos and The Hellenic Initiative. Beginning at 11 am, attendees enjoyed refreshments and hors d'oeuvres. At 12 pm the luncheon began in the Madison Room with a few opening remarks by Alumni Board Member Eunice Buhler who served as Alumni Weekend Co-Chair, and host Nick Alexos. Following the welcome remarks, lunch was served and mentoring began. Each table consisted of one to two mentors from a specific industry, with young professionals choosing their preferred table corresponding to their desired career field prior to the Luncheon. The event culminated with a speech from key note speaker, world-renowned physicist, Dr. Maria Spiropulu, Shang-Yi Che'en Professor of Physics at the California Institute of Technology. Dr. Spiropulu encouraged all young professionals in the room to live a life full of knowledge and never stop learning, nor stop teaching others.


















A MESSAGE FROM OUR CHAIRMAN

"TRANSFORMATION" OF THE FOUNDATION

Every day, we strive to honor the vision of our late founder, Chris P. Tomaras, by supporting young Greek American Scholars as he did. Since 2016, however, our Board of Directors has had to aggressively work on many transformations to position us well for continued growth and sustain Chris' vision. Our three areas of significant transformation are the following:

- 1) Going National, 2) Developing a Sustainable Donor Base, and 3) Expanding our "Beyond a Scholarship" initiative.
- **Going National:** We are more national in two ways. First, we are selecting from a larger pool of scholars that are more national and less from the Midwest. Secondly, our Advisory Board members and Board members are now not just from Illinois, but are coming from different areas of the country.

INTRODUCING SCHOLARSHIP 200

Each year, PanHellenic scholarship recipients with financial need are awarded \$10,000 toward their college education, providing them with significant economic relief. This is accomplished through the generous support of many repeat donors, who provide a named \$10,000 scholarship. These scholarships provide a life-changing award for our scholars, as well as a meaningful personal connection for our donors. With donors and scholars in mind, the Foundation created the Scholarship Society in 2018. This giving program was comprised of two levels; Scholarship 50 and Scholarship 100, both of which are a \$10,000 commitment for 5 years or 10 years, respectively.
